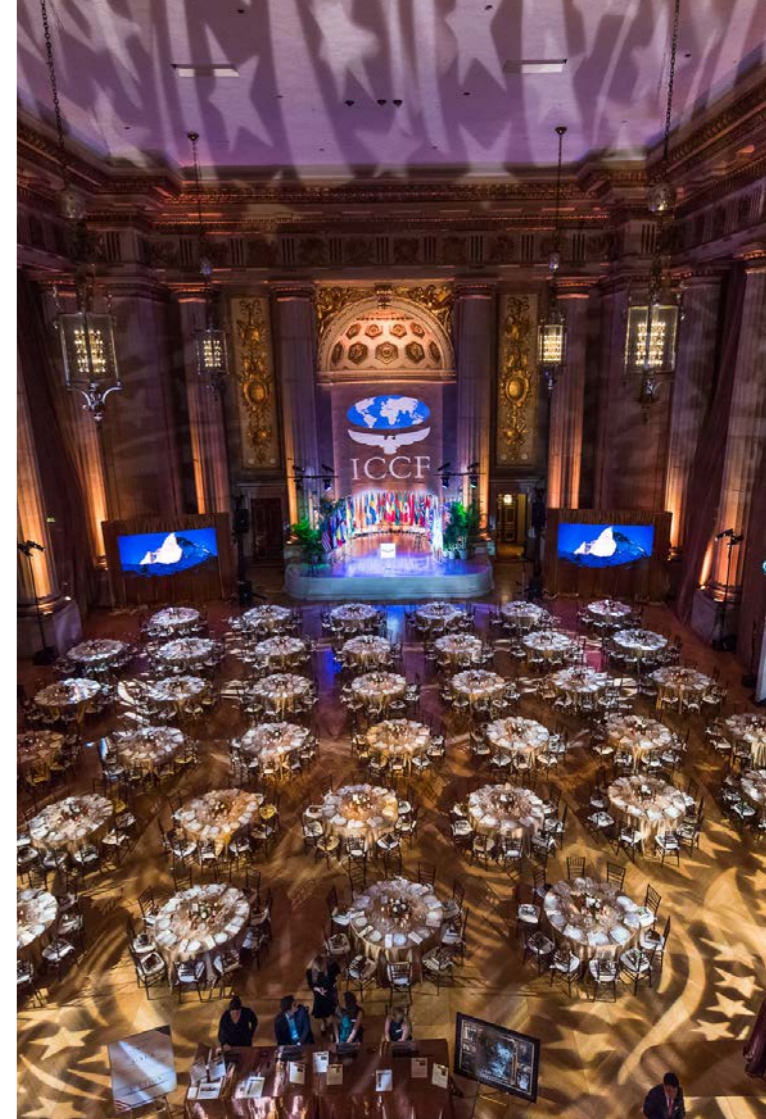

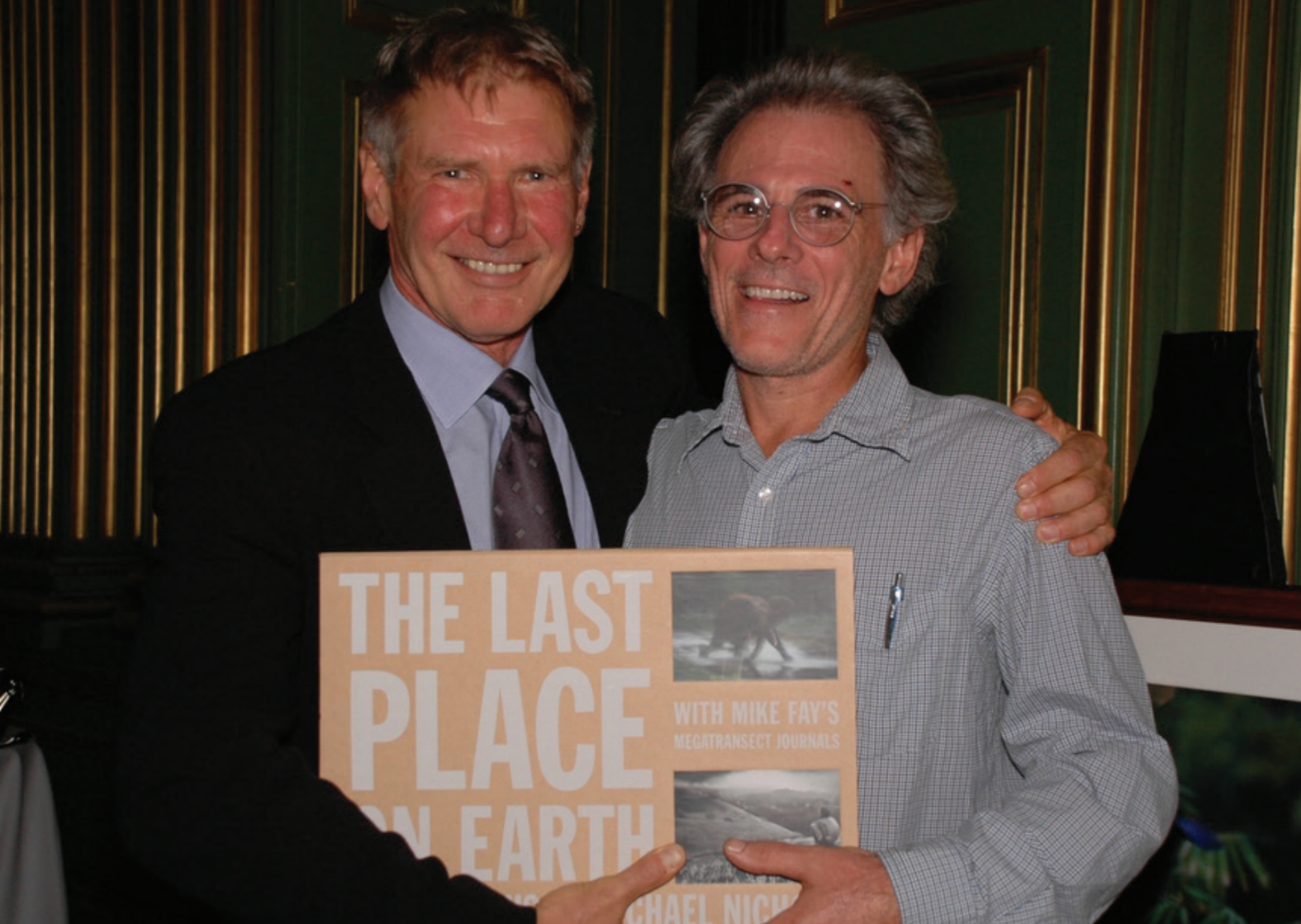

As President of Angola, His Excellency has demonstrated outstanding leadership in securing national parks and protected areas, in particular Iona National Park in the southwest of Angola. In December 2019, African Parks signed a long-term management agreement for the park with the then-Ministry of Environment (MINAMB) and the National Institute for Biodiversity and Protected Areas (INBAC), with an official hand-over ceremony taking place on January 31st, 2020.

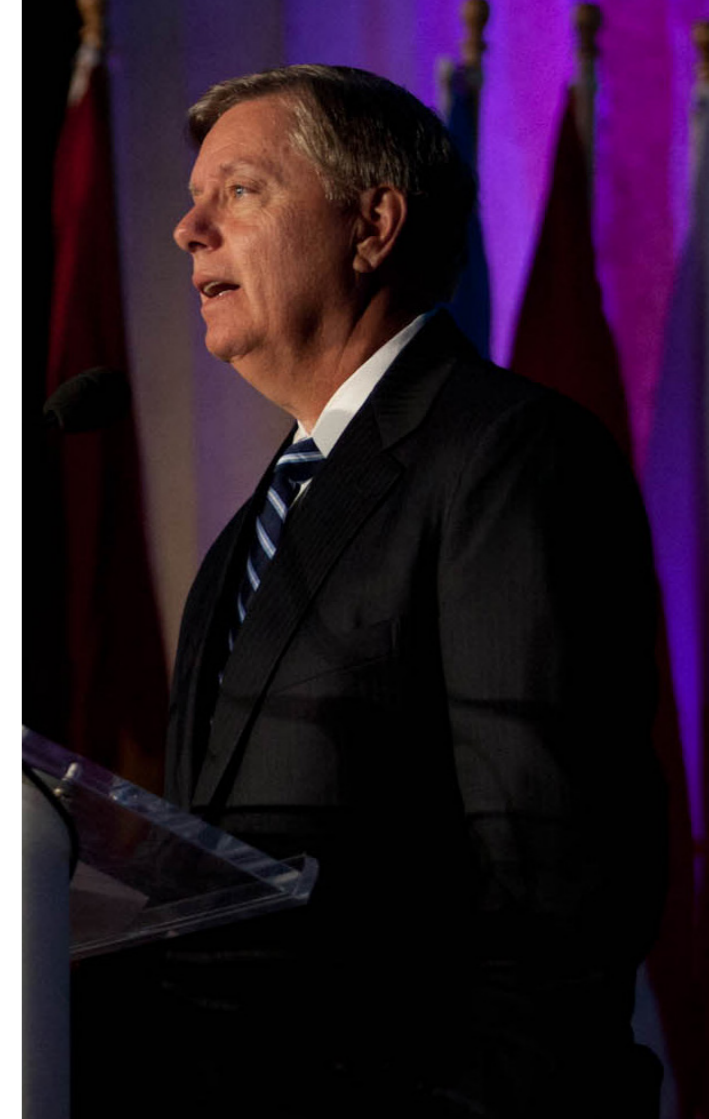
